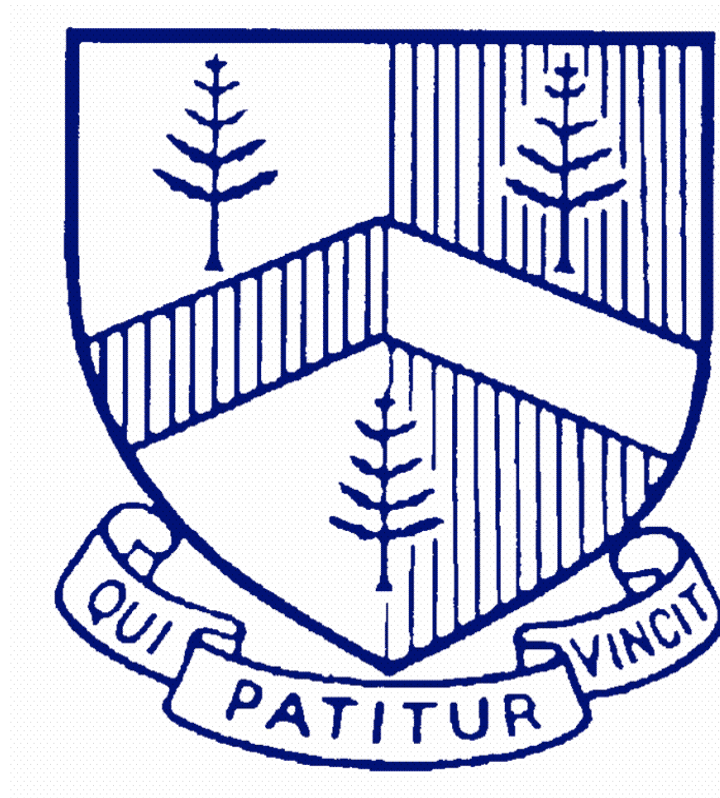

STUDENT INFORMATION IN FRONT OF THE BLUE BOOK: Student Achievement Awards

We have six Student Achievement Award categories, which recognise **excellence and effort** in:

- **Academic** endeavours,
- **Technology**,
- **Cultural** pursuits,
- **Sport**, and
- **Service** to the school and fellow students.
- **Kia Kaha**

How can you earn a Student Achievement Award?

In striving for **excellence** in any of these areas you will gain points towards an Achievement Award for that area.

For each area there is a **Record Card** which specifies the number of points that will be awarded for certain achievements.

When you believe you have met the requirements to earn points towards an Achievement Award take your booklet to the **teacher in charge of the particular area** (eg Ms Stewart for Orchestra) who will **complete and sign the booklet**.

Once you have earned **20 points in an area** hand your Student Achievement Award book into the office and you will be awarded an Achievement Award for that area in Wednesday assembly.

Should you earn **another 20 points** within the same area you will be awarded a **Star**.

Points earned on the **Wild Card** may be **added to any other area – 2 points per area** - (eg Service) to help you gain 20 points towards an Achievement Award.

NB Each of the activities for which points can be earned has a **Weighting Level** which gives recognition to those activities which require a long-term commitment or require a greater effort to achieve.

The awarding Weighting Level points is dependent on:

- **Attitude**
- **Behaviour**
- **Commitment and Attendance**
- **Being a positive team member**
